
Periode I (1) Technology Assessment in Ghana: Building Capabilities






**REQUEST FOR DANIDA ASSISTANCE FOR GHANA TELECOM
SECTOR RESTRUCTURING REVIEW**

I wish to refer to our Ghana/Danish meeting during your recent visit to Ghana in connection with the Policy Forum on Convergence of Media held in Accra on 17 January 2001, and hereby request for financial assistance in the form of grant aid by DANIDA for my Ministry to undertake a review of our telecom sector restructuring which has been contemplated as early 1997.

The review programme is one of our priority projects considered essential to restructuring revised strategies in promoting private sector participation in establishing an appropriate telecom infrastructure for the country. The project is estimated to cost about US\$75,000 and will be implemented as consultancy services over three-month period involving design, experts and local counterparts. The study will examine the various elements of the telecom sector: identification including achievements to date and make recommendations for the acceleration of the telecom infrastructure development.

It is my hope that you will be able to discuss our request with the appropriate authorities in good time as it is our intention to have this project completed before the end of this year.
